Provide High Ability students with a challenging, differentiated curriculum and instruction. Train Staff and stakeholders in the academic, social, and emotional needs of high ability students. Require High Ability students to use critical thinking skills at an accelerated level to develop a deeper understanding of advanced content while learning to responsibly interact with their grade level peers and adults.

Scott County School District 1 Appeals Process for High Ability Education	 Parents, teachers, & students may appeal or request reconsideration for a student to be identified as High Ability. Requests to appeal should be made through the Scott County School District I High Ability Coordinator at 812-794-8743. Steps: 1. Complete appeals form and submit to H.A. Coordinator 2. The petitioner compiles a portfolio for consideration. 3. The High Ability Selection Committee reviews the appeal and may request alternative assessments. 4. The District Coordinator will inform the petitioner in writing of the decision.
Scott County School District 1 Exit Procedure for High Ability Education	 The student, parent, or High Ability teacher/ coordinator may initiate the procedure. If a parent wishes to remove their child from the H.A. program, a letter requesting such action must be submitted to the District H.A. Coordinator and a "permission to exit" form will be placed in the students permanent file. If the educational institution wishes to review a

	student's eligibility, a conference needs to be requested with the building principal and H.A. Coordinator to review concerns (staff must have evidence of ongoing communication with parents regarding academic concerns). o The High Ability Coordinator will arrange a conference with all parties involved to examine concerns and discuss next steps. o A probationary period may be set to make adequate progress. A follow-up meeting will occur. o If the decision is made to exit or withdraw the student from the program, an exit form will be completed and kept on file.
